## KS4 PHOTOGRAPHY INTENT (TEACHING, DEVELOPING AND REFINING SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING)

All students in KS4 Photography build on the skills learned in KS3 in regards to the Elements and Principles of Art and Design. Students learn the basic controls of a DSLR and how to achieve a wide range of quality images without the reliance upon Auto settings. KS4 students are marked in accordance to the GCSE Assessment Objectives Rubric. Each project and its assessment is structured around the assessment objectives so each student clearly understands how they are marked, how to improve and how to show that improvement.

Assessment – all tasks are assessed under their Personal Portfolio with FAR marking 6 times a year. Closest grade used for data drops.
