1. Year 12 Work Experience will take place this year from Monday 4th to Friday 8th July. This is a fantastic opportunity for students to encounter the world of work, explore job sectors you may like to work in the future and gain valuable experiences to be able to write about in your personal statements. In previous years students have gained work experience in education, law, technology, business, finance and more. Many students have even travelled abroad to undertake their work experience! Aim high and apply to as many companies as possible. Please complete and return the attached form as soon as possible
2. The Cambridge University Sixth Form Law Conference was founded over forty years ago to give Year 12 students who may be interested in studying Law at degree level a balanced view of the Law, both as an academic subject and as a profession, and also to offer an insight into life as a Cambridge undergraduate. www.cambridgesixthformlawconference.com
3. Robinson College Access Program: Robinson College at Cambridge University are running an online scheme aimed at preparing students for university. The Year 12 strand will focus on academically-selective universities: what it's like to study at them, preparing to apply for these universities, and support in developing study skills and subject interests."
