On Wednesday we had a very engaging and thought-provoking talk from the Oxfordshire Fire Safety Team. Year 13: to do list

For Year 13 UCAS applicants: Attend applicant days to find out more about the universities you applied for and the course itself. Sometimes, universities may give you a reduced offer after you attend.

YEAR 12: to do list

Year 12 Residential summer school in Oxford: UNIQ Oxford (in person) – applications now open – deadline 7 February 2022 UNIQ is Oxford University's flagship access programme for UK state school students. It features loads of online support to help you make a strong application, and currently includes a residential in Oxford where you'll get to spend time in the Physics department working with academics and students and stay in one of the colleges. It's an amazing opportunity, and I strongly encourage anyone who is eligible to apply. The deadline is 7th February, so apply soon! It shouldn't take more than about 10 mins, so is well worth doing.
